- Dr. Richard Tipping on Palaeo-ecology,
- Catherine Smith on the archaeology of Scottish Medieval birds
- Emeritus Prof. Russell Coope on the subfossil history of insects.

After lunch, a choice of excursions has been laid on, going either to Montrose Basin to see a tsunami site and visit the SWT visitor centre, a coastal walk from Boddin Point to the spectacular Elephant Rock, or to Balgavies Loch for birds and woodland.
